## Senator Kavanagh talks state drug regulations with Coalition

State Sen. John Kava-nagh is confident a few bills aimed at further regulating the medical marijuana industry may become law this year.

He gave a legislative update at the Jan. 25 Fountain Hills Coalition sector meeting.

The coalition is charged with helping lower and prevent drug and alcohol usage among juveniles.

Five bills have been introduced concerning the

medical marijuana industry, but Kavanagh thinks two of them stand a good chance of being approved by the Arizona Legislature and ultimately signed by Gov. Doug Ducey.

Kavanagh prefaced his remarks by saying it is difficult to legislate changes to the medical marijuana industry since it was created by initiative and passed by voters.

"You need three-fourths of the Legislature to make amendments to it and any changes have to further the cause' of the initiative," he said.

One bill he thinks could pass would further regulate the packaging and labeling of medical marijuana products.

The bill states that packaging can't be attractive to minors and utilize such marketing gimmicks as cartoons, super heroes and other images clearly aimed at juveniles (such as selling candy infused with marijuana in the form of gummy bears, etc.).

Another bill he thinks has a good chance of passing both chambers would require medical marijuana facilities to have more inspections and tests to look for such things as mold, pesticides, the concentration of the active ingredient in marijuana, etc.

The industry won't like this, because it will give them more regulation," Kavanagh explained. "But they are legitimate inspections that should be done to ensure safety and the like."

In a related matter, the state senator said a num-

ber of bills were introduced through the governor's office to deal with the opioid crisis in Arizona.

The Arizona Legislature that same day (Jan. 25) approved a sweeping plan to fight the state's opioid epidemic. More than 800 lives have been lost in Arizona since June due to overdoses.


The Arizona Opioid Epidemic Act limits initial pain pill fills to five days for opioid naïve" patients and imposes a maximum dosage limit for others seeking new prescriptions.

In a rare show of bipartisanship, the proposal passed 30-0 in the Senate and 58-0 in the House.

Ducey called lawmakers into a special session on the issue and urged them to pass the act quickly to help prevent more overdose deaths.

"This one is tricky because we have to be cognizant of the rural areas and the fact a lot of them don't have pain specialists," Ka-vanagh told the coalition. "That could drive people into the illegal markets.

"If we over-regulate, then doctors won't treat chronic

pain. I think this bill is a reasonable compromise.'

The bill further added \$10 million to provide rehab services for people who can't afford treatment because they don't have insurance coverage.

Kavanagh also said there is a push to raise the legal age from 18 to 21 for tobacco use, along with vaping.

The coalition's next sector meeting is set for Thursday, March 8, at the School District's Learning Center.

The classes are scheduled the second Saturday of each month through April.
