

Myths on Vaping: Is it Safe?

No doubt you have seen some of the stories in the media recently following the latest update on the mysterious illness in relation to vaping. Not surprising, there are lots of inaccuracies and misconceptions about e-cigarettes and vaping. Youth vaping has become an epidemic. Youth e-cigarette use has sharply increased in Arizona and in Fountain Hills. According to US officials, there are three



reasons e-cigarettes may be particularly enticing to young people. First, many teens believe that vaping is less harmful than smoking. Second, e-cigarettes have a lower per-use cost than traditional cigarettes. Finally, vape cartridges are often formulated with flavorings such as apple pie and watermelon that appeal to younger users.

The office of the Arizona Attorney General Community Outreach and Education will be presenting a E-Cigarette and Vaping awareness night on September 17th that will focus on educating parents about the common myths and facts students have surrounding vaping and the use of e-cigarettes. Experts will provide information on the evolution of e-cigarettes and the dangers associated with the device and the chemicals people are inhaling when using them. The event is free for anyone at any age. It will be at the Church of Ascension (12615 N Fountain Hills Blvd) starting at 6:30pm
