



The Power of "Why" **A Discipline Tool That Could Save Your Sanity**



If there is anything that can push parents over the edge, it's children who don't do what they're told or listen to instructions. That's why this simple discipline tip is a helpful one. It's called "the power of why" and not only will it help you make communication headway, it will also teach your teen to think about others. Yes, it's possible! Here's how.

Research says that if people understand why you ask them to do something, they're more likely to do what you ask. When we discipline our children, there is one word that powerfully conveys the why behind our decisions: "because." When we tell our kids the reason for a request, it helps them look past themselves and process the request beyond its face value. Knowing the context gives them the chance to build their decision-making skills instead of giving an automatic, mindless no.

Here's an example to show some contrast: "Andrew, I want you to get your school clothes out tonight." Boom. Sure, he should do what I ask no matter how I ask it, but why not give him a better shot at making the right choice? "Andrew, I want you to get your school clothes out tonight because I don't want to run late tomorrow; I need to be on time for work."

HOW IT WORKS

1. Add water until vial is 2/3 full.



2. Empty DisposeRx powder into vial, replace cap and shake for 30 seconds.
